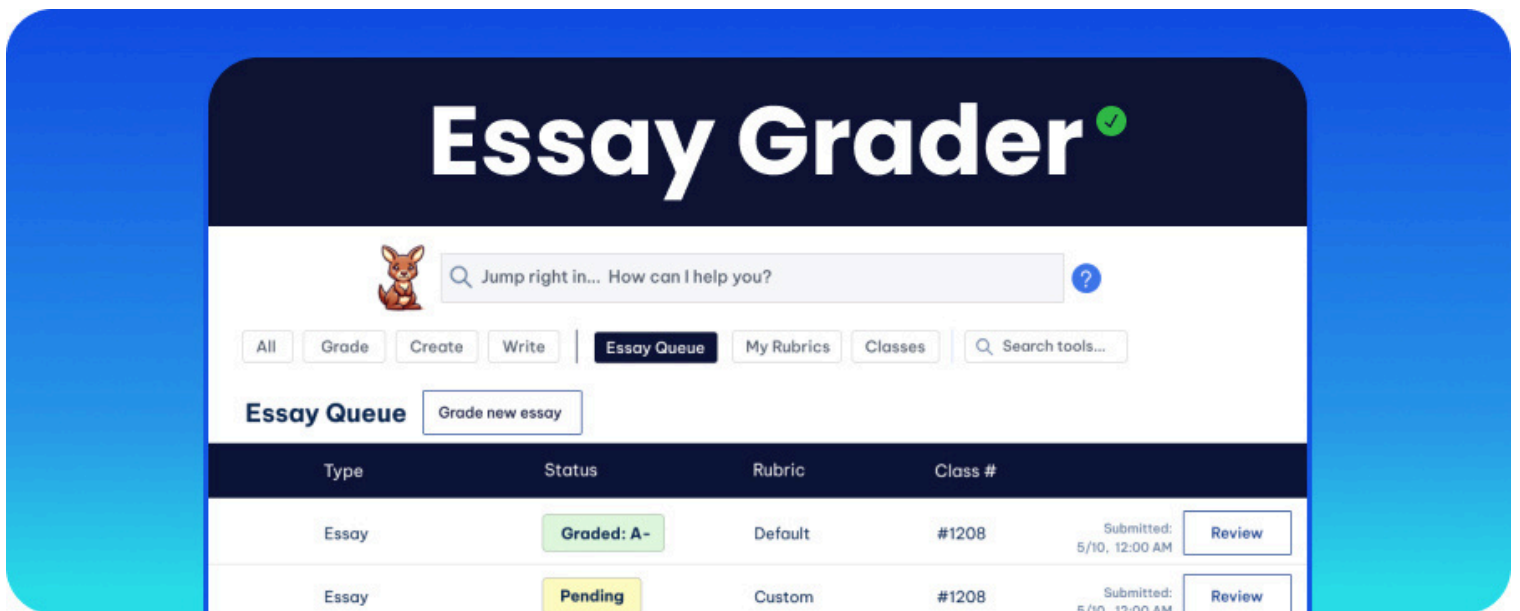

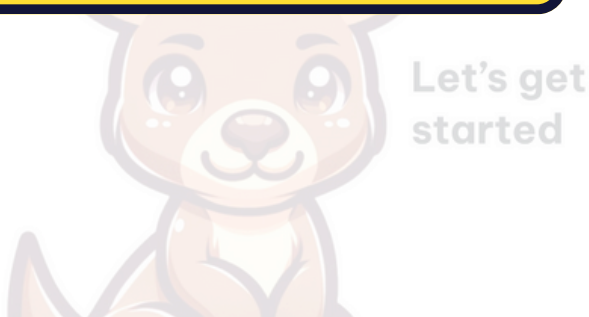

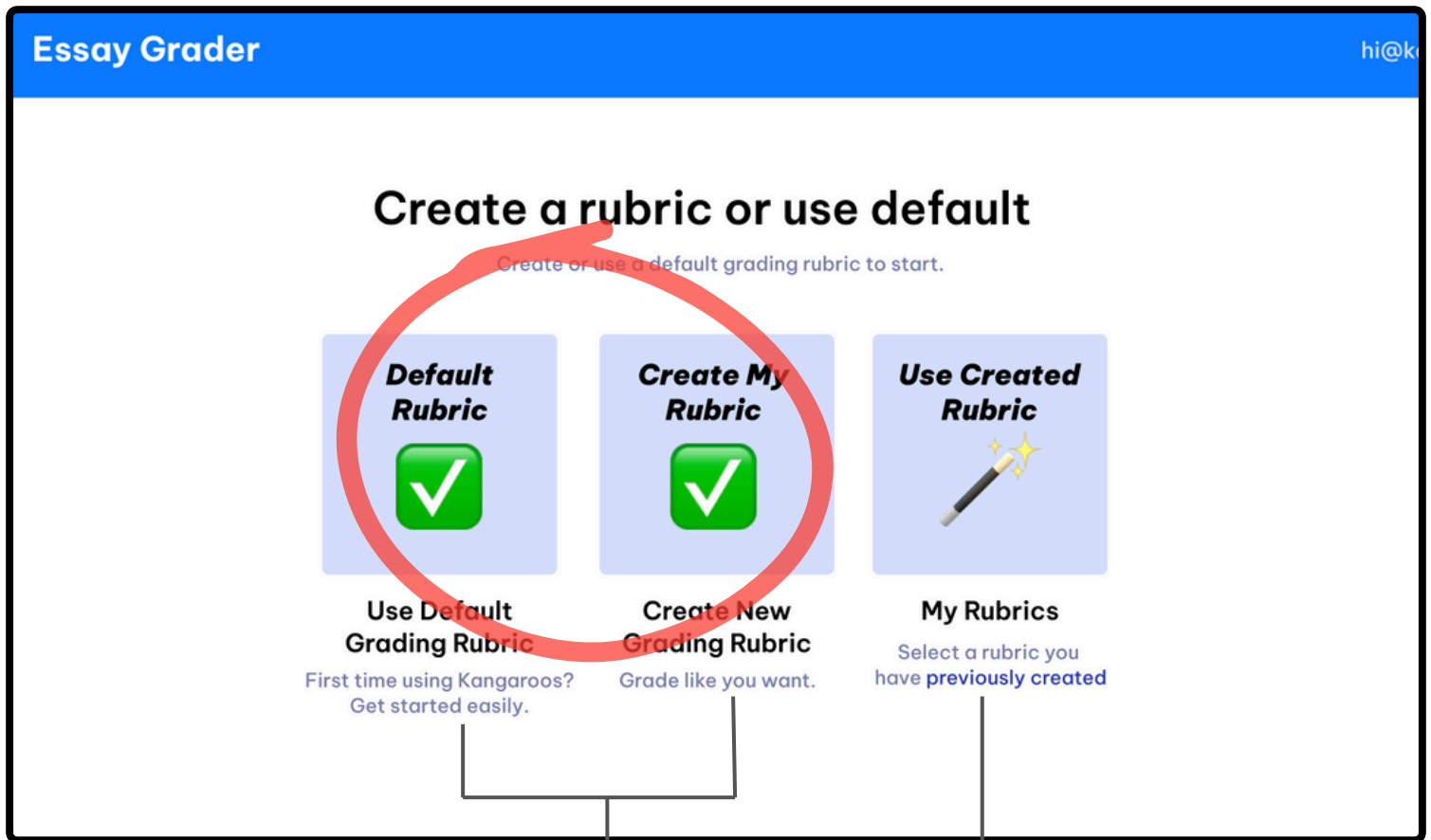

We offer both letter grades and points systems to give you flexibility in how you assess student work.

Letters:

- A (Excellent): 90-100%
- B (Good): 80-89%
- C (Average): 70-79%
- D (Below Average): 60-69%
- F (Failing): Below 60%

Points Grading Scale Explained:

The points system allows for more nuanced grading and can provide a detailed assessment of student performance.

Points System:

- A: 4.0 (Excellent)
- B: 3.0 (Good)
- C: 2.0 (Fair)
- D: 1.0 (Poor)
- F: 0.0

Beginner Tip:

Ensure points are fairly distributed. For example, if you define Originality worth 2 points and Critical Thinking worth 6 points, our app will ensure the distribution % is balanced.
